







Jennifer Lynn Barnes: Little White Lies (Book 1 The Debutantes Duology)






Zillah Bethell: The Song Walker (Carnegie Shortlist 2024)






Sophie Cameron: Away with Words (Carnegie Shortlist 2024)




Candy Gourlay: Wild Song [Carnegie Longlist 2024]


Simon James Green: Boy Like Me [Carnegie Longlist 2024]




Ravena Guron: Catch your Death




Tricia Levenseller: Daughter of the Siren Queen (Book 2 Daughter of the Pirate King)

Nathanael Lessore: Steady for This (Carnegie Shortlist 2024)




Anthony McGowan: Dogs of the Deadlands (Carnegie Longlist 2024)


R.J. Palacio: Pony


Katherine Rundell: Impossible Creatures


Amy Wilson: Snowglobe

Gabrielle Zevin: Memoirs of a Teenage Amnesiac







Nicola Davies and Peter Horacek: Choose Love <mark>(Carnegie Shortlist</mark> 2024)




Kwame Alexander: The Door of No Return (Carnegie Shortlist 2024)
